MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Observations from April UOSH Advisory Council Meeting

ASSP was well represented at the 2019 2nd quarter UOSH Advisory Council meeting. Cameron Ruppe, UOSH Director, reviewed fatality data and UOSHA inspection numbers through the 2nd quarter of the 2019 fiscal year.

In addition, Mr. Ruppe went over the recent OSHSPA meeting that occurred in Salt Lake City, where all the state plan OSHA states get together to talk about trends/topics that may affect them. The hottest topic at this meeting was related to ongoing pressure from Federal OSHA for state plan states to raise penalties to meet the same federal penalty levels. However, since penalty changes must be legislated in most state plan states, including Utah, it is unlikely that penalties for non-compliance with UOSH regulations will be raised unless federal OSHA comes up with a way to pressure or penalize the state plan states. Finally, the UOSH Director discussed upcoming events including: The stand down to prevent falls in construction from May 6-10; Trenching Stand Down from June 17-22; and the Utah Workplace Safety Week from June 17-21. Also, Mr. Ruppe discussed the upcoming meetings of industry specific workgroups and encouraged safety leaders to attend these. The next UOSH Advisory Council Meeting will be held on July 2nd.
