Our current President-Elect, Sarah Galvez, will become President on July 1, 2022.


We need the membership to ratify the uncontested positions and vote for President Elect.

#### **Book Review**



Thirteen Lessons That Saved Thirteen Lives: The Thai Cave Rescue

## Author: John Volanthen

In July of 2018, the world watched as courageous men and women came together in northern Thailand to witness the miraculous rescue of the Wild Boars soccer team and their coach. The group became stranded in the Tham Luan Cave during a rainy-season downpour while exploring after a practice and in celebration of a birthday for one of the players. The book tells the story from one of the instrumental rescuers responsible for finding and saving the Wild Boars and their coach after being trapped for nearly 10 days underground.

Each chapter is organized as a lesson that can be applied to life. These lessons are explained as:

- 1. Start with Why Not?
- 2. Listen to the Quiet Voice
- 3. Zoom In Zoom Out
- 4. Rest and Decompress
- 5. One Breath at a Time
- 6. Expect the Unexpected
- 7. Step Up and Step Back
- 8. Harnessing Teamwork and Trust
- 9. Hurry Up and Do Nothing
- 10. Keep it Simple
- 11. Rehearse Then Repeat
- 12. Make Success a Habit
- 13. Define Your Own Happiness

Aside from being a thrilling book with interesting facts about cave diving and underwater rescue, the book offers perspective about how to take a hopeless situation with many hazards and demonstrates how to carefully work through a process to safely succeed in what most others believed to be a hopeless endeavor by an unlikely group of "Clark Kents" rather than "Supermen".

As safety professionals we face challenges each day. Sometimes stakes are high and lives are on the line, and other times our integrity and professional judgement is questioned. Regardless of the challenge, we can all benefit from applying the 13 lessons that saved 13 lives to our profession and our personal lives.
